Position Summary

Your efforts will aid in the protection of rare species and the restoration of important ecological communities throughout the state. Duties include:

- Be a part of OKNP's prescribed fire crew
- Nature Preserve's trail maintenance & construction
- Property boundary marking & patrolling
- Brush & tree removal
- Invasive species management
- Equipment maintenance
- General upkeep of preserve parking areas
- Providing work reports



Spring 2022 OKNP Prescribed Fire Crew

Minimum Requirements:

- Thirty credit hours in college biology, natural resources, or a related field; OR a high school diploma and one year of experience in a natural resources job
- Applicants must possess a valid driver's license
- Applicants must be able to conduct strenuous labor and carry up to fifty-pound objects (e.g., backpacks) for extended periods of time under adverse field conditions and over uneven terrain
- Applicants must participate in prescribed fire (all necessary trainings will be offered on the job)
- Willingness and ability to travel overnight (up to five days at a time)
 - State vehicles provided, meals and lodging reimbursed
- Seldom weekend or alternative hours may be required for specific projects

Desired Skills:

- Ability to safely operate and maintain equipment, such as chainsaws, string trimmers, leaf blowers, brush cutters, power tools, pump units, ATV and 4WD vehicles
- Priority will be given to individuals certified by NWCG as FFT2 firefighter, or who have fire experience, or other comparable qualifications

Working Conditions:

- Selected candidates may be exposed to biting/stinging insects, venomous snakes, poison ivy, and adverse weather conditions (precipitation, temperature, and humidity extremes)
- Individuals often work in remote areas away from facilities and roads
